


Description

- The Core consists of individual stocks.
- The Satellite consists of various diversifying sub-asset class investments.



Core Investment Philosophy and Process



Our research team evaluates the universe of domestically traded stocks, narrowing potential investments to those companies with an improving profit outlook compared to sector peers. Fundamental analysis further refines this subset by targeting the stocks of companies with identifiable and sustainable sources of profit outlook improvement. Stocks of companies with these characteristics, trading at reasonable valuations, are candidates for inclusion in the strategy.


Portfolio Construction

Our portfolio construction is designed to maximize the benefits of positive security selection while employing diversification strategies to control risk. The Core component seeks to diversify risks across seventy to eighty individual securities, all eleven economic sectors, all three market capitalization sizes, and all three styles. This helps to limit the potential for any individual security, economic sector, size, or style to negatively impact relative returns. In addition, the portfolio seeks to limit exposure to companies whose sales, profits, and stock returns move together. This enhances the effectiveness of the diversification strategies. Finally, the strategy includes the Satellite component consisting of international equity and global real estate sub asset classes for diversification benefits.
